Myth: My child needs to be in all mainstream ("regular") classes right now, in order to go to college.

Reality:

The Sheltered courses offered at TPHS are in Math, Science, and Social Studies. Sheltered courses fulfill college preparatory requirements, thereby allowing English Learners to meet college entrance requirements while in the process of acquiring English language proficiency.

<u>ALL</u> Sheltered classes <u>except</u> ELD I-II and Sheltered Earth Space are <u>COLLEGE PREP!</u>

Myth: My child will learn more in mainstream ("regular") classes than in EL or Sheltered classes.

Reality: The Sheltered teachers have received special training to allow them to teach the content area while students are acquiring English.

- Sheltered classes are much smaller.
- In mainstream classes, EL students are expected to perform academically at a level near native speakers so their language needs (reading, writing, listening, speaking) may not be met.
- Remember...it takes 5-7 years to become proficient in a new language.

General High School Graduation Requirements

- Complete a minimum of 230 credits.
- Each class is worth 5 credits per semester.
- Complete all course requirements.
- Passing Integrated Math 1 is a state mandated graduation requirement.
- Passing Health (Edgenuity in Year 1 PE class)


