




<u>School hours:</u>

<u>Math Diagnostic Testing Project</u> (MDTP – All Students):


- -The assessment will help us determine whether students are ready for grade-level math. Students will take this assessment in their 6th grade class between March 18-April 26.

Integrated Math B Honors Readiness Test (IMBHRT - Optional):


- Grade skip (8th grade honors curriculum)
- <u>Must pass</u> with a 70% or higher





Physical Education (PE)

- PE is coed
- School PE uniform is recommended (students dress-out in PE clothes)
- Lockers are assigned to each student
- Students are graded on their "effort" in the required activities and state standards and NOT on their athletic ability.
- Emphasis on wellness
- <u>Curriculum Options Include</u>: pickle ball dance street hockey – soccer - flag football - team handball - large group recreational activities – volleyball - yoga stretches – frisbee interclass competitions - basketball - Fitness 15 - California state mandated fitness testing

Independent Study P.E.

Is this an option for my student?

1.) Must be an individual sport (no team sports)

2.) Must have direct instruction by qualified individual with proper insurance (The direct instruction requirement must be equal to or exceed the hourly requirement of the State of California P.E. statute. That requirement is 400 minutes every 10 school days/2 weeks.

- 3.) Students are accepted on a case by case basis
- 4.) Music students may take ISPE as a 7th class and choose a second elective.
- **Applications available online** *application window for 2019-20 opens April 15 and closes May 31, 2019.
- Please Note: ISPE is year-long class in SDUHSD middle schools



- Q: How do I apply for an Intradistrict Transfer?

- Q: When is the window to apply?
- A: March 15 March 29, 2019
- Q: When do I find out if my transfer is approved?

A: Typically within a few weeks after the window closes

Moving From Out of District/ Private Elementary School

Q: What do I need to do to register for PTMS?

A: When registration documents are dropped off at PTMS, your student's testing date will be assigned.

Entry Requirements by Age and Grade:

Vaccine	4-6 Years Old Elementary School at Transitional-Kindergarten/ Kindergarten and Above	7-17 Years Old Elementary or Secondary School	7th Grade*
Polio (OPV or IPV)	4 doses (3 doses OK if one was given on or after 4th birthday)	4 doses (3 doses OK if one was given on or after 2nd birthday)	
Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis (DTaP, DTP, DT, or Tdap)	5 doses of DTaP, DTP, or DT (4 doses OK if one was given on or after 4th birthday)	4 doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, Tdap, or Td (3 doses OK if last dose was given on or after 2nd birthday. At least one dose must be Tdap or DTaP/ DTP given on or after 7th birthday for all 7th-12th graders.)	1 dose of Tdap (Or DTP/DTaP given on or after the 7th birthday.)
Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR or MMR-V) Hepatitis B	2 doses (Both doses given on or after 1st birthday. Only one dose of mumps and rubella vaccines are required if given separately.) 3 doses	1 dose (Dose given on or after 1st birthday. Mumps vaccine is not required if given separately.)	2 doses of MMR or any measles-containing vaccine (Both doses given on or after 1st birthday.)

*New admissions to 7th grade should also meet the requirements for ages 7-17 years.
