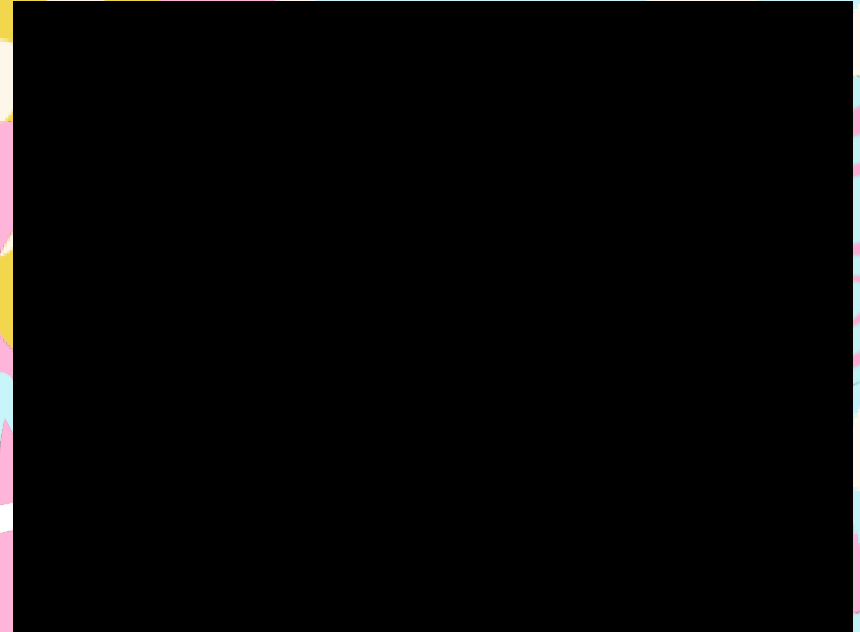

Each Crane made will then be a part of our very first Art Installation on our campus!

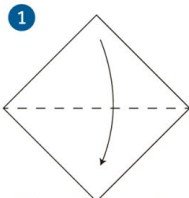
You are more than welcome to make more than one Crane. We would love for each student here at PTMS to have a Crane they created as a part of this project!

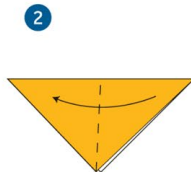

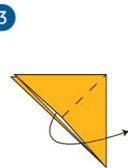

Starting with pattern face down, fold top corner to bottom corner



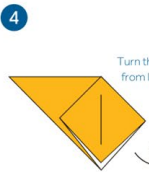
2

Fold right corner to left corner



3

While holding the other layers down, pick up the top layer from the edge and pull to the right...



4

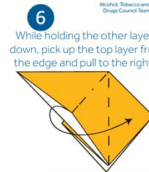
...and push the bottom corner down flat to make a diamond



5

Turn the crane over from left to right...

...then fold the top right corner from right all the way to the left as shown by the arrow



6

While holding the other layers down, pick up the top layer from the edge and pull to the right...

...and push the corner down flat to make a diamond



7

Fold the left and right top layer corners in to the centre line...

...then fold the top corner down...



8

...and unfold all step 7 folds



9

Hold down the top corner, then lift up the top layer from the bottom corner...



10

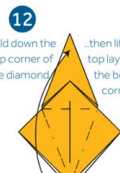
...and pull that corner all the way up while pushing in the sides and flatten



11

Turn the crane over from left to right

Fold the left and right corners in to the centre line then unfold



12

Hold down the top corner of the diamond, then lift up the top layer from the bottom corner...

...and pull that corner all the way up and flatten



13

Fold the left and right top layer corners in to the centre line



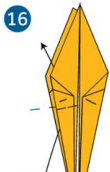

Turn the crane over from left to right



15

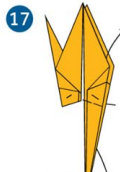
Fold the left and right corners in to the centre line



16

Hold the crane on the left...

...then lift the left top layer and pull the left point all the way up inside, then flatten



17

Hold the crane on the left...

...then lift the right top layer and pull the right point all the way up, then flatten



18

Hold the bottom left corner of the crane down then push the left point down and flatten to make the head



19

Pull the top points of the wings down and out



20

Well done! You've made an origami crane!
