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


Ruby Bridges

Born in 1954-
Present



- When Ruby Bridges was just 6, she advanced the cause of civil rights, being the first African-American girl to attend school in the South which was full of whites.
- Later she wrote 2 books about her early experiences. In 1999, Ruby established the Ruby Bridges Foundation to promote tolerance and create change through education. Ruby Bridges succeeded to be the first black girl to attend a school and only at 5 years old she advanced the cause of civil rights.
- Ruby Bridges created her own foundation which began by opening an after school multicultural art club. Then she started to go to many schools to promote cultural understanding by doing community service so racism can stop. This foundation gave all kids a chance at an amazing education.

Medgar Evers



July 2 1925 - June 12, 1963

- Medgar Evers was the first NAACP (National Association for the Advancement of Colored People) secretary in Mississippi, a state which at the time was regarded as the most racist in the country.
- During his decade-long career as a field secretary, Evers opened new chapters for NAACP, involved youth councils, investigated murders, organized voting registration drives, participated in boycotts, investigated and gathered evidence of “racially motivated incidents,” and promoted school desegregation.
- His actions as a NAACP secretary ensured justice for those who were wrongly or unfairly prosecuted for being black, and inspired youth to join equality campaigns and organized demonstrations.



Michelle Obama



- Michelle Obama fights for change in the education nutritional system by promoting a healthy balanced meal at school, and for every meal.
- She also promotes doing lots of physical activity and understands that the future generations on the education system, promoting cha


